ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 16th day of September
1964

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 5 of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948, as amended by section 11 (3) of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1961, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

O R D E R

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Most Favoured Nation Tariff Order 1964.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. The duties and exemptions from duty provided for in accordance with the Most Favoured Nation Tariff set out in the Customs Tariff, being the First Schedule to the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1961, as from time to time modified (whether before or after the commencement of this order), are hereby applied to goods being the produce or manufacture of the countries set out in the First Schedule hereto.

3. In its application to goods being the produce or manufacture of South Africa, this order shall be read subject to the provisions of section 5 (3) of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1961.

4. Nothing in this order shall be construed to affect the operation of the proviso to section 5 (2) (d) of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1961 (which relates to the application of certain rates and exemptions to goods being the produce or manufacture of Switzerland or Liechtenstein).

5. Subject to the provisions of the Cook Islands Customs Duties Order 1962* (as from time to time modified, whether before or after the commencement of this order), this order shall be in force in the Cook Islands.

6. The Orders in Council specified in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked to the extent indicated in that Schedule.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order consolidates and brings up to date the list of countries to which the Most Favoured Nation Tariff applies in accordance with the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948. The order lists in the First Schedule the countries to which that Tariff now applies, and consequentially revokes the earlier provisions set out in the Second Schedule.
