ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 8th day of August, 1945

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Marketing Act, 1936, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Order.

ORDER

1. This Order may be cited as the Meat Marketing Order 1942, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Meat Marketing Order 1942* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. (1) The principal Order is hereby amended by revoking the Schedule thereto (as enacted by clause 2 of the Meat Marketing Order 1942, Amendment No. 2), and substituting the following Schedule :--

(3) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the foregoing provisions of this clause, the principal Order, as heretofore amended, shall, with respect to meat that has been derived from stock killed before the 1st day of October, 1944, be read as if this clause had not been enacted.
