ORDER IN COUNCIL

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 39A of the Medical Practitioners Act 1968 (as inserted by section 2 of the Medical Practitioners Amendment Act 1986), His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice of the Minister of Health given after consultation by the Minister with the Medical Council of New Zealand, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Medical Practitioners (Registration of General Practitioners) Regulations 1987, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Medical Practitioners (Registration of General Practitioners) Regulations 1987* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1990.

2. Fees—Regulation 10(1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the expression “\$50”, and substituting the expression “\$67.50”.

3. Fee inclusive of goods and services tax—The fee fixed by these regulations is inclusive of goods and services tax under the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 April 1990, increase from \$50.00 to \$67.50 the fee payable by a general practitioner to the Medical Council of New Zealand, for registration in general practice and family medicine under the Medical Practitioners Act 1968.

The fee prescribed is inclusive of goods and services tax.
