Pursuant to section 40 of the Medical Auxiliaries Act 1966, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council, makes the following regulations.

Regulations

1 Title

- (1) These regulations are the Medical Radiation Technologists Amendment Regulations 2002.
- (2) In these regulations, the Medical Radiation Technologists Regulations 1995¹ are called “the principal regulations”.

2 Commencement

These regulations come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

3 First Schedule amended

- (1) The First Schedule of the principal regulations is amended by revoking items 3 and 4.
- (2) The First Schedule of the principal regulations is amended by revoking item 16, and substituting the following item:
“16 Bachelor of Health Science (Medical Radiation Therapy), University of Otago.”
- (3) The First Schedule of the principal regulations is amended by revoking item 17, and substituting the following item:
“17 Bachelor of Medical Imaging, Christchurch Polytechnic Institute of Technology.”

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*, amend the First Schedule of the Medical Radiation Technologists Regulations 1995. They change the prescribed list of training courses for people who wish to be registered as medical radiation technologists to reflect the dis-establishment of the Central Institute of Technology (CIT) and a change in the name of Christchurch Polytechnic. The effect of the changes is to—

- omit 2 courses, in therapeutic radiography and medical radiation therapy, that were previously offered by the CIT and that are now no longer available; and

- transfer the Bachelor of Health Science (Radiation Therapy) Degree course, previously offered by the CIT, to the University of Otago, and amend the name of the course to Bachelor of Health Science (Medical Radiation Therapy); and
 - update the name of Christchurch Polytechnic to Christchurch Polytechnic Institute of Technology.
