**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the New Zealand Council for Educational Research (Electoral College) Order 1998.

**3. **4. Consequential revocation**—The New Zealand Council for Educational Research (Electoral College) Order 1994 is consequentially revoked.

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EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This order, which comes into force on 8 December 1998, prescribes the membership of the electoral college of the New Zealand Council for Educational Research. This order alters the membership of the electoral college by adding the name of a former director of the Council in place of 1 member of the electoral college who has died.
