**REGULATIONS**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Patents (Transitional Applications) Amendment Regulations 1999, and are part of the Patents (Transitional Applications) Regulations 1994\* (“the principal regulations”).

(2) These regulations come into force on 1 July 1999.

**2. Fee removed**—Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations, which come into force on 1 July 1999, remove from the Patents (Transitional Applications) Regulations 1994 the \$50 fee previously payable on the giving of a notice under section 17 (2) of the Patents Amendment Act 1994.
