



**THE POISONS ACT EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1943**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL.**

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 28th day

**THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.**

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Poisons Act Emergency Regulations 1943.

2. (1) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the expression "the said Act" means the Poisons Act, 1934.

(2) For the purposes of the general interpretation hereof, these regulations shall be deemed to be made under the said Act, and, unless the context otherwise requires, expressions used herein have the same meaning as in the said Act.

3. (1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in clause (4) of Regulation 6 of the Poisons (General) Regulations 1937,\* it shall be lawful for any person with the prior written approval of the Minister of Health, granted at the request of the Minister of Agriculture, to store or sell strychnine in bottles which do not comply with paragraph (a) of the said clause, but which otherwise comply with the said clause, if the strychnine is sold either for the purposes of resale or for use in the poisoning of rabbits.

(2) Except as expressly hereinbefore provided, nothing in this regulation shall affect or derogate from the provisions of the said Act or any regulations thereunder.
