



**THE POISONS ACT EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1943,  
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

**THE HON. W. NASH PRESIDING IN COUNCIL**

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Poisons Act Emergency Regulations 1943, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Poisons Act Emergency Regulations 1943\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by adding thereto the following new regulation :—

“ 4. (1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in section 17 of the said Act, it shall be lawful for any person with the prior written approval of the Minister of Health, granted at the request of the Minister of Agriculture, to sell strychnine which does not comply with the provisions of the said section relating to the colouring of strychnine, if the strychnine is sold only for use in the poisoning of rabbits.

“ (2) Except as expressly hereinbefore provided, nothing in this regulation shall affect or derogate from the provisions of the said Act or any regulations thereunder.”
