PURSUANT to section 7 of the Pesticides Act 1979, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the Pesticides (Bacterial and Fungal Preparations) Order 1984.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Certain class of substances to be pesticides**—Every substance or mixture of substances that—

(a) Contains microbial pathogens (such as bacteria, fungi, nematodes, protozoa, Rickettsia, or viruses, or their mutants); and

(b) Is intended for use in the control of invertebrate pests, weeds, or crop pathogens,—

is hereby declared to be a pesticide for the purposes of the Pesticides Act 1979.
