PURSUANT to section 7 of the Pesticides Act 1979, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Pesticides (Bacterial and Fungal Preparations) Order 1984.
- (2) This order shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.
- 2. Certain class of substances to be pesticides—Every substance or mixture of substances that—
 - (a) Contains microbial pathogens (such as bacteria, fungi, nematodes, protozoa, Rickettsia, or viruses, or their mutants); and
 - (b) Is intended for use in the control of invertebrate pests, weeds, or crop pathogens,—

is hereby declared to be a pesticide for the purposes of the Pesticides Act 1979.
