THE POSTAL AMENDING REGULATIONS 1941, NO. 2.

C. L. N. NEWALL, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 13th day of August, 1941.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Postal Amending Regulations 1941, No. 2.

2. In these regulations "contractor" and "pharmaceutical requirements" have the same meanings respectively as in the Social Security (Pharmaceutical Supplies) Regulations 1941.*

3. A fee of 3d. in addition to ordinary postage shall be payable by the addressee for the delivery of each package containing pharmaceutical requirements, when prepayment of postage by the contractor is impossible or impracticable.

4. The sender shall wrap any receptacle containing pharmaceutical requirements when forwarded by post in strong corrugated cardboard and then place it in an outer cover of cardboard or stronger material containing sawdust or some spongy material in quantity sufficient to absorb the whole of the contents in the event of the breakage of or leakage from the receptacle. If this or a more effective method of packing is not followed, the sender shall be liable to make good damage to other articles in the mails caused by the breakage of or leakage from the receptacle.
