



THE POSTAL AMENDING REGULATIONS 1944

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 6th day of
September, 1944

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Postal Amending Regulations 1944.

2. These regulations shall come into force on the 8th day of September, 1944.

3. On each parcel containing plaited ware—that is to say, plaited baskets, trays, table-mats, hats, and grass skirts—posted in the Cook Islands, including Niue, to overseas countries there shall be charged a special postage fee of 1d. for each pound in addition to the overseas-postage rate ordinarily payable on the parcel.

4. The Postal Amending Regulations 1939 (No. 1) are amended by adding to Part (x) of the Second Schedule thereto, relating to inland parcels, the following additional section :—

“(f) Plaited Ware from Cook Islands

- “(i) In addition to the rates prescribed in the foregoing sections of this Part, or such of the said sections as may be applicable, on each parcel containing plaited ware posted in the Cook Islands, including Niue, to any address outside the Cook Islands, including Niue, for each pound or part of a pound s. d. 0 1
- “(ii) For the purposes of this section ‘plaited ware’ means plaited baskets, trays, table-mats, hats, and grass skirts.”
