**THE POSTAL AMENDING REGULATIONS 1948, NO. 2**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington, this 22nd day of  
December, 1948

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Postal Amending Regulations 1948, No. 2.

2. The Amending Postal Regulations made on the 15th day of August, 1927,\* are hereby amended by revoking Regulation 16 under the heading "Letters and Letter-cards" and the subheading "Posted in Window Envelopes", and substituting the following regulation:—

" 16. A letter or other article addressed in lead-pencil or copying-ink pencil and enclosed in a window envelope cannot be accepted for transmission in the inland or international post. Window envelopes may, however, be used, provided the addresses are written in ink or prepared by means of the typewriter or a printing process in a dark colour and are perfectly legible through the transparent panel. In addition, in the inland post, articles may be enclosed in window envelopes in cases in which the addresses are prepared by carbon process with pencil or stylo and are perfectly legible."
