Pursuant to the Patents, Designs, and Trade-marks Act, 1921–22, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Patents Amending Regulations 1950, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the regulations relating to patents made on the 26th day of June, 1922* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 2. Regulation 15 of the principal regulations, as amended by subsection three of section two of the Patents, Designs, and Trademarks Amendment Act, 1929, is hereby further amended by omitting the words "such further time thereafter as the Commissioner may allow", and substituting the words "three months thereafter".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

This amendment relates to Convention applications for the grant of patents, and will enable the certified copy or copies of the specification or specifications and drawings or documents filed or deposited by the applicant in respect of the first foreign application to be deposited in New Zealand without fee within three months after the making of the New Zealand application. The amendment brings regulation 15 of the principal regulations into harmony with articule 4, paragraph D. 3, of the International Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property.
