THE PRISONS AMENDING REGULATIONS 1950

THE HON. K. J. HOLYOAKE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Prisons Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Prisons Amending Regulations 1950, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Prisons Regulations 1925* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) The principal regulations and their amendments, including these regulations, may together be cited as the Prisons Regulations 1925 to 1950.

2. Regulation 159 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following regulation substituted :—

“ 159. Candidates for employment in the Prisons service must :

“ (a) Be not less than twenty-one years of age at the date of appointment ;

“ (b) Produce two satisfactory references (of recent date) as to character ;

“ (c) Be not less than 5 ft. 8 in. in height :

“ Provided that exceptions to this requirement may be made in special circumstances ; and

“ (d) Be of good physique and prepared to submit to medical examination if required.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations vary the requirements for candidates for employment in the Prisons service by abolishing the maximum age limit of thirty-six years, and by making optional the requirements as to minimum height and medical examination.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act, 1936.
