## THE POSTAL AMENDING REGULATIONS 1952 (NO. 2)

G. W. M. NORRIE, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL
At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 17th day of December 1952

Present:
The Hon. K. J. Holyoake presiding in Council
Pursuant to the Post and .Telegraph Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Postal Amending Regulations 1952 (No. 2).
(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1953.
2. (1) The rates of postage for postal packets and the charges for postal services and all other services referred to in the First Schedule hereto shall be the appropriate rates and charges specified in that Schedule.
(2) The regulations specified in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

Note (1).-A trailer film or advertising matter may be included in a container, and any such trailer film or advertising matter shall be charged for as an ordinary parcel, in addition to the postage on the films. Trailer films shall be enclosed in round tins 7 in . in diameter and about 2 in . in depth fitted with press-in lids.

Note (2).-It shall be permissible to enclose in a film container, in addition to five films, up to two smaller films enclosed in tins each weighing approximately $5 \frac{1}{2} \mathrm{lb}$. When one small film is enclosed, the charge shall be that for a 7 lb . parcel, and when two small films are enclosed, the charge shall be that for a 14 lb . parcel, plus the "express transit" fee in each case if necessary.

The fees prescribed for air transport for inland parcels include "express transit" (without additional fee) by surface transport for any portion of the route over which air transport is not available.

## (f) Plaited Ware from Cook Islands

(i) In addition to the rates prescribed in the foregoing sections of this Part, or such of the said sections as may be applicable, on each parcel containing plaited ware posted in the Cook Islands, including Niue, to any address outside the Cook Islands, including Niue, for each pound or part of a pound
(ii) For the purposes of this section, " plaited ware" means plaited baskets, trays, table mats, hats, and grass skirts.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations increase the rates of postage for certain postal packets and the charges for postal services, including rates of postage for letters, post cards, printed papers, commercial papers, " householder" circulars, newspapers, parcels, insurance rates, and the fee for registration.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936.
Date of notification in Gazette: 18 December 1952.
These regulations are administered in the Post and Telegraph Department.
