THE POSTAL AMENDING REGULATIONS 1959

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 16th day of September 1959

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Postal Amending Regulations 1959.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1959.

2. (1) The rates of postage for postal packets and the charges for postal services and all other services referred to in the First Schedule hereto shall be the appropriate rates and charges specified in that Schedule.

(2) The regulations specified in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

SCHEDULES

FIRST SCHEDULE

RATES OF CHARGES FOR POSTAGE AND OTHER SERVICES

(i) LETTERS

To foreign countries—

(a) By surface transport 6d. for first oz; 4d. each additional oz.

(b) By overseas air transport where available Such postage as may from time to time be required for the appropriate air transport.

(ii) POSTCARDS

To foreign countries—

(a) By surface transport Single, 4d.; reply, 8d.

(b) By overseas air transport where available Such postage as may from time to time be required for the appropriate air transport.

FIRST SCHEDULE—*continued*

(iii) COMMERCIAL PAPERS, PRINTED PAPERS, GOVERNMENT PUBLICATIONS, LIBRARY EXCHANGES AND BOOKS FOR LIGHTKEEPERS, LITERATURE FOR THE BLIND, "HOUSEHOLDER" CIRCULARS, BUSINESS REPLY CARDS, ENVELOPES AND WRAPPERS

(a) Commercial papers—

Overseas 6d. for first 10 oz; 1d. each additional 2 oz.

(b) Printed papers (including all printed advertising matter, books, periodicals, catalogues, price lists, newspapers and magazines printed overseas, and unregistered newspapers and magazines printed in New Zealand, circulars, Christmas and New Year greetings, visiting cards, notices of meetings and notices generally, invitation cards, photographs, and voting papers)—

Overseas 2d. for first 2 oz; 1d. each additional 2 oz up to 6½ lb (maximum), with the exception that books in a single package may weigh up to 11 lb.

(iv) PACKETS (INCLUDING PATTERNS AND SAMPLES)

Overseas (samples only) 6d. for first 10 oz; 1d. each additional 2 oz up to 5 lb to British Commonwealth countries, and up to 1 lb to foreign countries.

(v) SMALL PACKETS

Overseas only 2d. for each 2 oz (with a minimum charge of 10d.) up to 2 lb.

(vi) MAGAZINES PRINTED AND REGISTERED IN NEW ZEALAND

Overseas 2d. for first 2 oz; 1d. each additional 2 oz (printed paper rate).

(vii) NEWSPAPERS PRINTED AND REGISTERED IN NEW ZEALAND

Foreign countries 2d. for first 2 oz; 1d. each additional 2 oz.

SECOND SCHEDULE

REGULATIONS REVOKED

The Postal Amending Regulations 1952 (No. 2).*

(a) Item 3 of paragraph (i).

(b) Item 3 of paragraph (ii).

(c) So much of subparagraph (a) of paragraph (iii) as relates to overseas postage.

(d) So much of subparagraph (b) of paragraph (iii) as relates to overseas postage.

(e) So much of paragraph (iv) as relates to overseas postage.

(f) Paragraph (v).

(g) So much of paragraph (vi) as relates to overseas postage.

(h) So much of paragraph (vii) as relates to postage to foreign countries.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations increase the rates of postage for certain postal packets for overseas countries, including letters, postcards, printed papers, commercial papers, sample packets, small packets, and newspapers.
