# THE POSTAL AMENDING REGULATIONS 1971

Pursuant to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the GovernorGeneral, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement-(1) These regulations may be cited as the Postal Amending Regulations 1971.
(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 15 th day of February 1971.
2. Rates of postage, etc.-The rates of postage for postal articles and the charges for postal services and all other services referred to in the First Schedule to these regulations shall be the rates and charges specified in that Schedule:

Provided that the Postmaster-General may authorise the payment of rates and charges below those so specified in such circumstances as he may determine in the case of multiple postings of any one class of postal articles.
3. Revocations-The regulations specified in the Second Schedule to these regulations are hereby revoked.

## FIRST SCHEDULE

## Inland Postage Rates and Fees for Other Services

1. Letters-The following postage is payable in respect of letters:
(a) For letters sent by surface mail

4 c for a letter not exceeding 1 oz .
6 c for a letter exceeding 1 oz but not exceeding 2 oz .
8 c for a letter exceeding 2 oz but not exceeding 4 oz .
14 c for a letter exceeding 4 oz but not exceeding 8 oz .
25 c for a letter exceeding 8 oz but not exceeding 1 lb .
50c for a letter exceeding 1 lb but not exceeding 2 lb .
50 c for each additional 2 lb in excess of 2 lb .
5 c for the first half ounce.
2c for each additional half ounce.
(b) For a letter sent by airmail
2. Postcards-The following postage is payable in respect of postcards:
(a) For a postcard sent by surface mail .. .. .. .. 3c each.
(b) For a postcard sent by airmail .. .. .. .. .. 4c each.
3. Printed matter-The following postage is payable in respect of printed matter:
(a) For ordinary printed matter. . 3 c for each 8 oz up to 2 lb 8 oz .
(b) For a Government publication 6c per pound of separately addressed packages weighed together. Provided that, with the exception of the School Fournal and the Education Gazette, each package weighs at least 4 oz .
(c) For library exchanges and books for lightkeepers
(d) For registered magazines up to 2 oz (publishers' rate)*
(e) For registered newspapers (publishers' rate)*

For each copy, the ordinary rate, less 25 percent discount $\dagger$.
For each copy, the ordinary rate up to 2 lb 8 oz , less 25 percent discount $\dagger$.
(f) For unregistered magazines and unregistered newspapers, and for registered magazines over $2 \mathrm{oz} \ddagger$
(g) For householder circulars and samples-
(i) Circulars and small
$1 \frac{1}{2} \mathrm{c}$ for each article not weighing more than 2 oz . flat samples
(ii) Sample packets .. 3c for each article not weighing more than 2 oz .
4. Literature for the blind-No postage is payable in respect of literature posted for blind persons if the article weighs not more than 15 lb .
5. Express delivery packages-The following postage is payable in respect of packages delivered by express delivery:
(a) For a package not exceeding 3 lb , in weight, 5 c for each mile up to 3 miles.
(b) For a package exceeding 3 lb , but not exceeding 6 lb , in weight, 10 c for each mile up to 3 miles.
6. Business reply post-One cent in addition to postage at the rates prescribed for the appropriate category is payable in respect of each article sent "business reply post".
7. Registration-The following postage is payable in respect of registered postal articles:

| (a) For any article registered for an amount up to $\$ 40$ | . | .. |  | 18 |

(b) For any article registered for an amount more than $\$ 40$ but not more than $\$ 80$
(c) For each additional $\$ 40$ of registered value or fraction thereof up to a maximum of $\$ 800$
*This rate applies only where at least 20 copies are posted at the one time.
$\dagger$ The granting of the discount is conditional upon the sender complying with reasonable requests for the presentation of the articles in lots according to districts, towns, and other relevant considerations.
$\ddagger$ This rate applies only where at least 100 copies are posted at the one time.

8. Advice of delivery of registered article-The charge payable in respect of an advice of delivery of a registered article is 12 c , but if an advice of delivery to the addressee only is required, the charge is 30 c .
9. Late fee-The late fee payable in respect of a letter or postcard is 4 c in addition to postage.
10. Parcels-(1) The postage rates for parcels are assessed on the basis of the following zones:
(a) Zone 1-Postal Districts of Whangarei, Auckland, Hamilton, Thames, Rotorua, and Gisborne.
(b) Zone 2-Postal Districts of New Plymouth, Wanganui, Palmerston North, Napier, Masterton, and Wellington.
(c) Zone 3-Postal Districts of Blenheim, Nelson, Westport, Greymouth, Christchurch, and Timaru.
(d) Zone 4-Postal Districts of Oamaru, Dunedin, and Invercargill.
(2) The following postage is payable in respect of parcels:
(a) For an ordinary parcel (that is, a parcel not exceeding 3 ft 6 in . in length or 6 ft in length and girth combined, or where more than 1 in . thick, 4 ft 6 in . in length and girth combined):

*Zonal rates do not apply.
$\dagger$ It shall be permissible to enclose in a film container, in addition to 5 films, up to 2 smaller films enclosed in tins each weighing approximately $5 \frac{1}{2} \mathrm{lb}$. When 1 film is enclosed, the charge shall be that for a 7-1b parcel; and when 2 films are enclosed, the charge shall be that for a 14-1b parcel, plus the "express transit" fee in each case if applicable.
$\ddagger$ A trailer film or advertising matter may be included in a container, and any such trailer film or advertising matter shall be charged for as an ordinary parcel, in addition to the postage on the films. Trailer films shall be enclosed in round tins 7 in . in diameter and about 2 in . in depth fitted with press-in lids.

(iii) For cinematograph films in fireproof containers, for each film in the container-
For a film weighing up to 14 lb .. .. an additional fee of 12 c .
For a film weighing over $14 \mathrm{lb} \quad . \quad$.. an additional fee of 25 c .
(h) A fee of 10 c per pound or part thereof shall, notwithstanding anything in paragraphs (a) to (d) of this clause, be payable for each parcel sent by air transport to or from the Chatham Islands in addition to the charge for air transport for that parcel as set out in the appropriate paragraph of this clause.
11. Customs clearance fee-For each postal article a Customs clearance fee of 20 c is payable.
12. Demurrage-The following demurrage is payable in respect of postal articles:
(a) If the article is collected within 5 working days after the end of the demurrage-free period
(b) If the article is collected after the expiration of the period referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause ..

10c per day.
*For the fee payable in respect of a rod-shaped parcel over 3 ft 6 in . in length see clause 10 (c).

13. Pharmaceutical requirements-For each package of pharmaceutical requirements posted by a chemist under the Social Security (Pharmaceutical Supplies) Regulations 1961 a fee of 3c additional to postage shall be payable by the addressee.
14. Private letter box rental rates-The following charges are payable in respect of the renting of private letter boxes:
(a) At the chief post offices or postal centres (if any) at Auckland, Christchurch, Dunedin, and Wellington:
(i) To a person residing within the limits of the delivery by postman: $\begin{array}{ll}\text { For a box of the small size } & . . \\ \text { For a box of the large size } & \text { At the rate of } \$ 7 \text { per annum. } \\ \text { At the rate of } \$ 14 \text { per annum. }\end{array}$
(ii) To a person residing beyond the limits of the delivery by postman:

For a box of the small size .. At the rate of $\$ 2$ per annum. For a box of the large size ... At the rate of $\$ 4$ per annum.
(b) At other places where there is a postman's delivery:
(i) To a person residing within the limits of the delivery by postman:

For a box of the small size .. At the rate of $\$ 6$ per annum.
For a box of the large size ... At the rate of $\$ 12$ per annum.
(ii) To a person residing beyond the limits of the delivery by postman:

For a box of the small size .. At the rate of $\$ 2$ per annum.
For a box of the large size .. At the rate of $\$ 4$ per annum.
(c) At places where there is no postman's delivery:

For a box of the small size .. At the rate of $\$ 2$ per annum.
For a box of the large size .. At the rate of $\$ 4$ per annum.
15. Private mail-bag charges-(1) The fee for a private bag for the delivery of correspondence to an address which is within an area served by a postman's delivery shall be as follows:
(a) For a bag which is collected at the post office by the holder:
(i) $\$ 20$ a year for each closing a day, Monday to Friday:
(iii) \$6 a year for each closing on Saturday:
(iii) $\$ 8$ a year for each closing on Sunday:
(b) For a bag which is delivered by the Post Office:
(i) $\$ 20$ a year for each closing a day, Monday to Friday:
(ii) $\$ 6$ a year for each closing on Saturday:
(iii) $\$ 8$ a year for each closing on Sunday.

There is also payable under this paragraph a delivery charge of $\$ 40$ per annum for each closing a day if the bagholder resides within 1 mile of the delivery office and an additional charge of $\$ 30$ per annum for each additional mile of delivery.
(2) The fee for a private bag for the delivery of correspondence to an address which is outside an area served by a postman's delivery shall be as follows:

16. Rural mail service charges-The following rural mail service charges are payable:
(a) For delivery three times weekly or less . . .. .. .. \$1 a year.
(b) For delivery more often than three times weekly. . .. .. $\$ 2$ a year.
17. Register of newspapers and magazines-The fee for the entering of a newspaper or magazine in the register of newspapers and magazines shall be 50 c .
18. Postal stationery-The following charges are payable in respect of postal stationery:
(a) An envelope bearing 4 c postage .. .. .. .. .. 5c.
(b) An envelope bearing 5c postage .. .. .. .. .. 6c.
(c) A letter card bearing 4 c postage .. .. .. .. .. 5c.
(d) A postcard bearing 3c postage .. .. .. .. .. 4c.
(e) A wrapper bearing 3c postage .. .. .. .. .. 4c.
(f) A registered-letter envelope bearing 4c postage and 18c registration fee .. 24 c .
19. Gold bullion charge-A protection fee of 3c per ounce avoirdupois is payable in respect of parcels of gold bullion sent to Australia by post.
20. Stamp coils-For postage stamps of the 3 c and 4 c denominations in coils of 400 a fee of 20 c per coil is payable in addition to the value of the stamps.
21. Redirection orders-A charge of $\$ 1$ is payable in respect of each renewal of a redirection order after a period of 12 months.
