- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Podiatrists Amendment Regulations 1999, and are part of the Podiatrists Regulations 1982* ("the principal regulations").

EXPLANATORY NOTE

These regulations, which come into force on 1 April 1999, increase the annual licence fee paid by podiatrists.
