**THE POST AND TELEGRAPH REGULATIONS, 1918,
AMENDMENT NO. 1.**

Enacting authority : His Excellency the Governor-General in Council.
Act pursuant to which the regulations were made : Section 230 of the
Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, and all other powers enabling
in that behalf.

Date on which the regulations were made : 16th day of September, 1936.
Date of notification in *Gazette* : 24th day of September, 1936.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Post and Telegraph Regulations, 1918, Amendment No. 1.
2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the regulations under the Post and Telegraph Department Act, 1918,* made by Order in Council, and published in the *Gazette* of the 23rd December, 1925, at page 3460 (hereinafter called "the principal regulations").
3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of September, 1936.
4. Regulation 69 (1) of the principal regulations is amended by revoking the word "forty-four" in clause (b) thereof, and substituting the word "forty."
5. Regulation 69 (2) of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following substituted :—
" 69. (2) The rate of payment for overtime shall be at a rate equal to the hourly rate of pay of the officer concerned ; provided that the rate shall be not less than one shilling and sixpence. In the case of message-boys, the rate shall be not less than eightpence an hour."
