# THE POST AND TELEGRAPH (STAFF) REGULATIONS 1925, AMENDMENT NO. 11.

Enacting authority: His Excellency the Governor-General in Council.

Act pursuant to which the regulations were made: The Post and
Telegraph Act, 1928.

Date on which the regulations were made: 15th day of December, 1937. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 22nd day of December, 1937.

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Post and Telegraph (Staff) Regulations 1925, Amendment No. 11.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the regulations made under the Post and Telegraph Department Act, 1918, on the 14th day of December, 1925\* (hereinafter called "the principal regulations"), as heretofore amended from time to time
- 3. These regulations shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making hereof.
- 4. Regulation 24 of the principal regulations (as heretofore amended) is amended by revoking the words "Cadet (Engineering)", and substituting the words "Cadet (Technical)"; and by revoking the words "physical science", and substituting the word "physics".
- 5. Regulation 31 of the principal regulations (as heretofore amended) is revoked and the following substituted:—
- "31. No officer shall be eligible for promotion to the position of Senior Overseer, Overseer, Assistant Overseer, Chief Mechanician, Senior Mechanician, Mechanician in Charge, Foreman Mechanic, or such other position in the Second Division of the same grade of classification as the Director-General from time to time may decide until he has passed the Controlling Officer's Examination provided to test his fitness for such a position: Provided always that any officer occupying a position in the Second Division of a higher grade of classification than that of Line Foreman on the date on which this regulation comes into force shall be eligible for advancement without a pass in the Controlling Officer's Examination."
- 6. Regulation 34 of the principal regulations (as heretofore amended) is amended by revoking the expression "Class VII" in clauses (1) and (2), and substituting the expression "Class VI".

- 7. Regulation 36 of the principal regulations (as heretofore amended) is revoked, and the following substituted:—
  - "36. No person shall be appointed—
  - "(1) As a Technical Clerk unless he has qualified by examination as a Technical Cadet and has passed the Technical Clerk's Examination.
  - "(2) As a Technical Supervisor unless he has qualified by examination as a Technical Cadet and has passed the Technical Supervisor's Examination.
  - "(3) As a Technical Assistant unless he has passed the Technical Assistant's Examination.
  - "(4) As an Assistant Engineer unless he has qualified as a Technical Assistant, has passed such further examination or examinations as may be prescribed from time to time, and has had not less than three years' practical engineering experience.
  - "(5) As a Telegraph Engineer unless he has qualified as an Assistant Engineer and has passed the examination prescribed for a Telegraph Engineer:
    - "Provided that officers fully qualified for appointment to the position of Assistant Telegraph Engineer, or Telegraph Engineer, prior to the date on which this regulation comes into force shall continue to be eligible for appointment to the position of Assistant Engineer or Telegraph Engineer as the case may be; and that those partly qualified may satisfy the requirements of this regulation either by completing the examinations previously in force, or by passing such combination of the previous and the new examinations as may be approved by the Director-General."
- **8.** Regulation 66 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking the word "transferred", and substituting the words "required to reside".
- 9. Regulation 76 (2) of the principal regulations is amended by revoking the words "on full pay" in clause (c), and substituting the words "granted on such conditions as may be determined by the Director-General"; and by adding the following paragraph:—
  - "(d) Officers who have completed the B.Sc. degree and are desirous of obtaining the M.Sc. degree of the New Zealand University may be granted leave to attend lectures during the College session at a University, provided the subjects to be studied are of value to the Department. Such leave shall not, however, exceed eight hours per week and shall be granted on such conditions as may be determined by the Director-General."
- 10. Regulation 148 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking the word "Public", and substituting the words "Post Office".
