THE POST AND TELEGRAPH (STAFF) REGULATIONS 1925, AMENDMENT NO. 13.

GALWAY, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 23rd day of August, 1939.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, and Part II of the Master and Apprentice Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Post and Telegraph (Staff) Regulations 1925, Amendment No. 13.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the regulations made under the Post and Telegraph Department Act, 1918, on the 14th day of December, 1925* (hereinafter called the principal regulations), as heretofore amended from time to time.
- 3. These regulations shall come into force on the day following notification in the Gazette of the making hereof.†
- 4. Regulation 62 of the principal regulations (as heretofore amended) is amended by revoking the words—
- "Officers receiving £361 10s. a year or over 2 3 "Officers receiving under £361 10s. a year 1 9 "
 and substituting the following words:—

 "Officers receiving £400 a year or over . . . 2 6 "Officers receiving under £400 a year 2 0"
- 5. Clause (1) of Regulation 63 of the principal regulations (as heretofore amended) is amended by revoking the words "at the rate of £13 10s. per annum", and substituting the words "at the rate of £15 per annum".

6. Clauses (1) and (8) of Regulation 67 of the principal regulations (as heretofore amended) are revoked, and the following substituted respectively:

Officers entitled to lodging-allowance, when appointed to relieving duty involving separate payment for such duty, will not be entitled to claim lodgingallowance for a longer time than one week after the relieving duty commences."

7. Regulation 72 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking the words" an officer's "and the words" any officer", and substituting the words "an employee's "and "any employee", respectively, and by inserting the words "or wages" after the word "salary".

- 8. The principal regulations are amended by adding thereto the following additional regulations:—
- "168. Every apprentice employed by the Department shall be bound by these regulations except as hereinafter expressly provided.
- "169. With the exception of leave granted annually for recreation purposes, leave for military or naval training, and leave resulting from an accident on duty, the apprentice may be required by the master to make up, after the date when the term of apprenticeship would normally be completed, any time lost through absence from duty during the term of apprenticeship.
- "170. (a) In the case of inefficiency or misconduct of an apprentice, the provisions of Regulation 124 shall apply, but shall be read subject to section 26 of the Master and Apprentice Act, 1908.
- "(b) In the case of an apprentice, the amount of the fine which may be imposed by the permanent head under clause (3) of Regulation 124 is limited to a maximum of £5."
