THE POST AND TELEGRAPH (STAFF) REGULATIONS 1925, AMENDMENT NO. 18

C. L. N. NEWALL, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 20th day of December, 1944

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Post and Telegraph (Staff) Regulations 1925, Amendment No. 18.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the regulations made under the Post and Telegraph Department Act, 1918, on the 14th day of December, 1925, and published in the Gazette on the 23rd day of the same month at page 3460 (hereinafter called the principal regulations), as heretofore amended from time to time.
- 3. Clause (5) of Regulation 59 of the principal regulations, as heretofore substituted, is revoked, and the following substituted:—
- "(5) Where workmen are detailed to perform duty which necessitates their absence from headquarters at night, and it is not in the best interests of the Department to establish a camp, the following allowances may be paid:

"Provided that a workman in charge of a party may be paid 1s. per diem in addition after the first two weeks."

4. Clause (1) of Regulation 67 of the principal regulations, as heretofore substituted, is revoked, and the following substituted:—

"(1) With the exception of those officers and employees referred to in Regulation 59, all officers and all persons employed in a temporary capacity may, when required to perform duty away from headquarters, be paid travelling-allowance for personal expenses at the following rates :-

"(a) Officers drawing salaries not exceeding £180 per

heretofore substituted, is revoked, and the following substituted:-"(8) With the exception of those officers and employees referred to in Regulation 59, officers called upon to perform relieving duty which necessitates their absence at night from home may be paid allowances at the following rates:—

"For the first day of absence from head-

"(a) To officers drawing salaries not exceeding £145 per

annum: Actual and reasonable expenses. "(b) To officers drawing salaries exceeding £145 per annum but not exceeding £295 per annum 126 "(c) To officers drawing salaries exceeding £295 per annum

but not exceeding £470 per annum 15 0 "(d) To officers drawing salaries exceeding £470 per annum

"Claims made by officers drawing salaries not exceeding £145 per annum for a refund of actual expenses are to be supported by vouchers, and will be subject to revision by the Permanent Head. Officers entitled to lodging-allowance, when appointed to relieving duty involving separate payment for such duty, will not be entitled to claim lodging-allowance for a longer time than one week after the relieving duty commences."
