Pursuant to the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Post and Telegraph (Staff) Regulations 1925, Amendment No. 19.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the regulations made under the Post and Telegraph Department Act, 1918, on the 14th day of December, 1925* (hereinaftr called the principal regulations), as heretofore amended from time to time.
- 3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April, 1945.

[&]quot;† An employee will be advanced to the Thirteenth Subdivision only if his services are of the required standard of efficiency, and if he has had not less than twenty years' continuous superannuation service, and if he has for a consecutive period of at least eight years been in receipt of the salary prescribed by this scale for officers of the Twelfth Subdivision of Class VI of the First Division or in receipt of the salary prescribed by the scale heretofore in force for officers of the Fourth Subdivision of Class VI of the First Division or successively in receipt of the respective salaries so prescribed."
