THE POST AND TELEGRAPH (STAFF) REGULATIONS 1925, AMENDMENT NO. 21

At the Government House at Wellington, this 23rd day of January, 1947

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Post and Telegraph (Staff) Regulations 1925, Amendment No. 21.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the regulations made under the Post and Telegraph Department Act, 1918, on the 14th day of December, 1925* (hereinafter called the principal regulations), as heretofore amended from time to time.
- 3. These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1946.
- 4. Regulation 33 of the principal regulations as heretofore substituted is hereby revoked, and the following substituted:—
- "33. (1) An officer for the time being in Class VI of the First Division shall not be advanced to the twelfth subdivision of Class VI as shown in the scale set out in the First Schedule hereto unless—
 - " (a) His services are of the required standard of efficiency; and

"(b) He has passed the Controlling Officer's Examination prescribed by Regulation 34; and

"(c) He has had not less than twenty years' continuous permanent service (for the purposes of this paragraph any messageboy service in excess of three years being deemed to be permanent service); and

"(d) He has completed not less than eight years' continuous qualifying service in Class VI, which for the purposes of this paragraph means service in one or more of the subdivisions specified in the following table during the period

in which any such subdivision is or was applicable as specified in the table:—

"(2) The Permanent Head may, at his discretion, in special cases vary or modify the provisions contained in paragraphs (c) and (d) of clause (1) hereof if he deems the circumstances to be such as to

justify such action.

- "(3) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, an officer in Class VI of the First Division who, on the 31st day of March, 1946, was in receipt of a classified salary of £400 per annum shall be deemed to be eligible for advancement to the twelfth subdivision as from the 1st day of April, 1946."
- 5. The Post and Telegraph (Staff) Regulations 1925, Amendment No. 20, and the scale set out in the Schedule thereto of rates of salaries and increments of officers of the First Division, are hereby revoked.
- 6. The principal regulations are amended by inserting as the First Schedule thereto, in lieu of the substituted Schedule hereby revoked, the following Schedule:—
