THE POST AND TELEGRAPH (STAFF) REGULATIONS 1925 AMENDMENT NO. 22

At the Government House at Wellington, this 5th day of November, 1947

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Post and Telegraph (Staff) Regulations 1925, Amendment No. 22.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the regulations made under the Post and Telegraph Department Act, 1918 (and enuring under the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928), on the 14th day of December, 1925 (hereinafter called the principal regulations), as heretofore amended from time to time.
- 3. Regulation 63 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following regulation substituted:—
- "63. (1) Any employee who, with the approval of the Director-General, performs the duties of a position of an employee in the same Division of a higher class or grade than that in which he is classified, or, in the case of a temporary employee, performs duties which the Director-General considers to be of a higher class than those on which the temporary employee is usually engaged, may be paid an allowance as hereinafter provided for the whole period during which he performs the higher duties, provided they are performed continuously for a period of not less than one full working-week.

"(2) In all cases the Director-General shall determine the amount

of the allowance that may be paid:

"Provided that the amount shall not exceed the difference between the employee's regular salary and the salary of the holder of the higher position, and shall not be less than the difference between the employee's salary and the minimum salary in the class next above that in which he is classified.

- "(3) Any employee classified in the Second Division who performs the duties of an employee classified in the First Division may be paid an allowance at a rate of not less than £15 per annum for any period of not less than one full working-week's duration during which he so acts.
- "(4) Absence on approved leave shall not be deemed to interrupt the performance of higher duties or, as the case may be, First Division duties, provided that the employee, on his return from leave, resumes the performance of the same (or other) higher or First Division duties; but the allowance shall not be paid for the period of his absence."
