**THE POST AND TELEGRAPH (STAFF) REGULATIONS 1925,
AMENDMENT NO. 25**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 1st day of
November, 1949

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Post and Telegraph (Staff) Regulations 1925, Amendment No. 25.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and deemed part of the regulations made under the Post and Telegraph Department Act, 1918 (and enuring under the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928), on the 14th day of December, 1925 (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. The First Schedule to the principal regulations, as replaced by Regulation 4 of the Post and Telegraph (Staff) Regulations 1925, Amendment No. 24, shall be deemed to have been hereby revoked on the 1st day of July, 1948, and the following Schedule substituted therefor for the period commencing on the said 1st day of July, 1948, and expiring on the 31st day of May, 1949 :—

5. On and from the 16th day of May, 1949, clause (5) of Regulation 59 of the principal regulations, as replaced by Regulation 4 of the Post and Telegraph (Staff) Regulations 1925, Amendment No. 23, shall be deemed to have been hereby revoked, and the following clause substituted therefor :—

“(5) Where workmen are detailed to perform duty which necessitates their absence from headquarters at night, and it is not in the best interests of the Department to establish a camp, the following allowances may be paid :—

“ Provided that a workman in charge of a party may be paid 1s. per diem in addition after the first two weeks.”

6. Clauses (1) and (8) of Regulation 67 of the principal regulations, as replaced by Regulation 5 of the Post and Telegraph (Staff) Regulations 1925, Amendment No. 23, shall be deemed to have been hereby revoked on the 1st day of July, 1948, and the following clauses substituted therefor respectively for the period commencing on the said 1st day of July, 1948, and expiring on the 15th day of May, 1949 :—

“(1) With the exception of those officers and employees referred to in Regulation 59, all officers and all persons employed in a temporary

capacity may, when required to perform duty away from headquarters, be paid travelling-allowance for personal expenses at the following rates:—

“(a) Officers drawing salaries not exceeding £280 per annum : Actual and reasonable expenses.	Per Diem.
“(b) Officers drawing salaries exceeding £280 per annum but not exceeding £507 per annum	£ s. d. 1 0 0
“(c) Officers drawing salaries exceeding £507 per annum but not exceeding £607 per annum	1 2 6
“(d) Officers drawing salaries exceeding £607 per annum	1 5 0
“Provided that while at sea, if the time occupied is more than twenty-four hours, the allowance to the officers referred to in the foregoing paragraphs (b) to (d) inclusive shall be—	
“For the first day of absence from headquarters	s. d. 10 0
“For every subsequent day	2 6 ”

“(8) With the exception of those officers and employees referred to in Regulation 59, all officers called upon to perform relieving duty which necessitates their absence at night from home may be paid allowances at the following rates:—

“(a) Officers drawing salaries not exceeding £255 per annum : Actual and reasonable expenses.	Per Diem.
“(b) Officers drawing salaries exceeding £255 per annum but not exceeding £412 per annum	£ s. d. 0 15 0
“(c) Officers drawing salaries exceeding £412 per annum but not exceeding £607 per annum	0 17 6
“(d) Officers drawing salaries exceeding £607 per annum	1 0 0 ”

7. On and from the 16th day of May, 1949, the following clause shall be deemed to have been hereby substituted for clause (1) of Regulation 67 of the principal regulations, as replaced as aforesaid by the preceding Regulation 6 hereof:—

“(1) With the exception of those officers and employees referred to in Regulation 59, all officers and all persons employed in a temporary capacity may, when required to perform duty away from headquarters, be paid travelling-allowance for personal expenses at the following rates:—

“(a) Officers drawing salaries not exceeding £499 per annum	Per Diem. £ s. d. 1 5 0
“(b) Officers drawing salaries exceeding £499 per annum but not exceeding £999 per annum	1 10 0
“(c) Officers drawing salaries exceeding £999 per annum but not exceeding £1,499 per annum	1 15 0
“(d) Officers drawing salaries exceeding £1,499 per annum	1 17 6

“Provided that an extra payment of 2s. may be made in respect of any occasion when one night only is spent at the one hotel.

“Provided further that while at sea, if the time occupied is more than twenty-four hours, the allowance to the officers referred to in the foregoing paragraphs (a) to (d) inclusive shall be—

“For the first day of absence from headquarters	s. d. 10 0
“For every subsequent day	2 6 ”

8. For the period commencing on the 16th day of May, 1949, and expiring on the 31st day of May, 1949, the following clause shall be deemed to have been hereby substituted for clause (8) of Regulation 67 of the principal regulations, as replaced as aforesaid by the preceding Regulation 6 hereof :—

“ (8) With the exception of those officers and employees referred to in Regulation 59, all officers called upon to perform relieving duty which necessitates their absence at night from home may be paid allowances at the following rates :—

“ (a) Officers drawing salaries not exceeding £280 per annum ; Actual reasonable expenses.	Per Diem.
“ (b) Officers drawing salaries exceeding £280 per annum but not exceeding £447 per annum ..	£ s. d. 1 0 0
“ (c) Officers drawing salaries exceeding £447 per annum but not exceeding £607 per annum ..	1 2 6
“ (d) Officers drawing salaries exceeding £607 per annum	1 5 0 ”

9. On and from the 1st day of June, 1949, the following clause shall be deemed to have been hereby substituted for clause (8) of Regulation 67 of the principal regulations, as replaced as aforesaid by the preceding Regulations 6 and 8 hereof :—

“ (8) With the exception of those officers and employees referred to in Regulation 59, all officers called upon to perform relieving duty which necessitates their absence at night from home may be paid allowances at the following rates :—

“ (a) Officers drawing salaries not exceeding £285 per annum ; Actual reasonable expenses.	Per Diem.
“ (b) Officers drawing salaries exceeding £285 per annum but not exceeding £460 per annum ..	£ s. d. 1 0 0
“ (c) Officers drawing salaries exceeding £460 per annum but not exceeding £620 per annum ..	1 2 6
“ (d) Officers drawing salaries exceeding £620 per annum	1 5 0 ”

10. On and from the 16th day of May, 1949, clause (6) of Regulation 67 of the principal regulations, as replaced by Order in Council made on the 30th day of January, 1931, and published in the *Gazette* of the 12th February, 1931, at page 277, shall be deemed to have been hereby amended by the addition of the following paragraph :—

“ An extra payment of 2s. made in respect of any occasion when one night only is spent at the one hotel shall not be deemed to be part of the scale rate for travelling-allowance.”

11. Regulations 4 and 5 of the Post and Telegraph (Staff) Regulations 1925, Amendment No. 23, and the Post and Telegraph (Staff) Regulations 1925, Amendment No. 24, are hereby revoked.
