THE POST AND TELEGRAPH STAFF REGULATIONS 1951, AMENDMENT NO. 10

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 6th day of June 1956

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act 1928, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 10, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April 1956.

3. (1) Regulation 39 of the principal regulations, as amended by regulation 4 of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 7, is hereby further amended by revoking the provisos to subclause (1), and substituting the following proviso:

“Provided that the minimum rate shall be 3s. 10½d. an hour and the maximum rate shall be 14s. 9d. an hour, except that in the case of an employee under the age of fifteen years the rate shall be not less than 3s. 9d. an hour.”

(2) Regulation 4 of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 7, is hereby revoked.

4. (1) Regulation 40 of the principal regulations, as amended by Regulation 5 of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 7, is hereby further amended by revoking the provisos to subclause (1) and substituting the following proviso:

“Provided that the minimum rate shall be 5s. 3d. an hour and the maximum rate 14s. 9d. an hour, except that in the case of an employee under the age of fifteen years the rate shall be not less than 5s. an hour.”

(2) Regulation 5 of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 7, is hereby revoked.

5. (1) Regulation 52 of the principal regulations, as substituted by regulation 3 of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 1, is hereby amended by revoking subclause (3) and substituting the following subclause:

“(3) The hourly rate of pay of an employee receiving salary or wages at a rate other than hourly shall be deemed to be a part thereof computed as follows:

Of an annual salary or wage . . . One two thousand and eighty-eighth.
Of a weekly salary or wage . . . One fortieth.”

(2) Subclause (3) of regulation 3 of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 1, is hereby revoked.

6. (1) Regulation 53 of the principal regulations, as amended by regulation 6 of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 7, is hereby further amended by omitting the figures “£1,045” where they appear in subclause (1) or in subclause (3), and substituting in each case the figures “£1,110”, and also by omitting the figures “£1,220” where they appear in subclause (2) or in subclause (3), and substituting in each case the figures “£1,300”.

(2) Regulation 6 of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 7, is hereby revoked.

7. (1) Regulation 61 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclauses (2) and (2A), as substituted by regulation 8 of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 7, and substituting the following subclause:

“(2) The scales of travelling allowances shall be as follows:

(2) Regulation 8 of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 7, is hereby revoked.

8. (1) Regulation 62 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclauses (3) and (3A), as substituted by regulation 9 of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 7, and substituting the following subclause:

“(3) The scale of relieving allowances shall be as follows:

(2) Regulation 9 of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 7, is hereby revoked.

9. (1) The principal regulations are hereby further amended by revoking the First, Second, and Third Schedules thereto as substituted by regulation 12 of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 7, and substituting the following Schedules:
