**THE POST AND TELEGRAPH STAFF REGULATIONS 1951,
AMENDMENT NO. 5**

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 17th day of March 1954

THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of February 1954.

3. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 135, the following regulation:

“135A. Notwithstanding anything contained in the principal regulations, the Director-General may, in his discretion, prescribe the Professional Examinations in Accountancy as an essential prerequisite for appointment or promotion to certain specified positions that shall be notified from time to time in official vacancy lists or other publications having general distribution in the Department.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE
