

THE POST AND TELEGRAPH STAFF REGULATIONS 1951, AMENDMENT NO. 6

At the Government House at Wellington, this 30th day of June 1954

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 6, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Except where otherwise provided, these regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 8th day of January 1954.

3. (1) Regulation 61 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (2), as substituted by regulation 11 of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 3, and substituting the following subclause:

"(2) The scales of travelling allowances shall be as follows:

- 4. (1) Regulation 62 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (3), as substituted by regulation 12 of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 3, and substituting the following subclause:
 - "(3) The scale of relieving allowances shall be as follows:

- 5. (1) Regulation 68 of the principal regulations, as amended by regulation 16 of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 3, is hereby further amended by omitting from subclause 2 the words "shall be 3s. 6d.", and substituting the words "shall be 4s.".
- (2) Regulation 16 of the Post and Telegraph Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 3, is hereby revoked.
- (3) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April 1954.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

Regulations 3 and 4 provide for increases in the rates of allowances paid to officers whose duties take them away from their headquarters. Regulation 5 provides for an increase in the meal allowance payable in certain circumstances.
