PURSUANT to the Stock Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Pigs Branding Order 1954.

2. A brand, in the case of pigs, shall consist of an earmark made by cutting or punching the ear with pliers.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.]

The order prescribes that a brand for pigs shall consist of an earmark.
