THE PAPER (GENERAL) CONTROL NOTICE 1942

PURSUANT to the Factory Emergency Regulations 1939,* I, George Augustus Pascoe, the Factory Controller, hereby direct and give notice as follows:—

1. This notice may be cited as the Paper (General) Control Notice 1942.
2. This notice shall come into force on the 15th day of May, 1942.
3. No person shall type duplicate or write any matter or cause or permit any matter to be typewritten duplicated or written—
 - (a) Upon paper larger than is necessary when both sides are used :
 - (b) With margins at sides, top, and bottom of the sheet of paper larger than are necessary for legibility and reasonable convenience.
4. Nothing in the last preceding clause shall be deemed to require printer's copy to be typed or written on both sides of the paper.
5. No person shall type or duplicate any typewritten matter or cause or permit any matter to be typed or any typewritten matter to be duplicated if such matter is of a commercial or professional character otherwise than with single-spacing.
6. The last preceding clause shall not apply to drafts requiring space for revision.
7. No person shall use or cause or permit to be used any envelope which exceeds in area the equivalent of an area 6 in. by 3½ in.
8. The last preceding clause shall not apply to the use of envelopes for enclosures which are intended to pass forthwith out of the possession of the user and the size and weight of which make the use of an envelope of area larger than hereinbefore specified reasonably necessary for the safety in transit of the contents.
