**THE PATENTS, DESIGNS, AND TRADE-MARKS CONVENTION  
ORDER 1940.**

GALWAY, Governor-General.  
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 3rd day of April, 1940.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to section 54 of the Patents, Designs, and Trade-marks Amendment Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order and declare as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Patents, Designs, and Trade-marks Convention Order 1940.
2. Each of the countries named in Part A of the First Schedule hereto is a convention country for the purposes of all the provisions of the Patents, Designs, and Trade-marks Act, 1921-22 (hereinafter referred to as the Act).
3. Each of the countries named in Part B of the First Schedule hereto is a convention country for the purposes of all the provisions of the Act with the exception of the provisions contained in section 68 of the Patents, Designs, and Trade-marks Amendment Act, 1939.
4. The Union of South Africa, ~~British~~ India, and ~~British~~ Burma are each a convention country for the purposes of all the provisions of the Act which relate to patents or designs, with the exception of the provisions contained in section 68 of the Patents, Designs, and Trade-marks Amendment Act, 1939.
5. Ecuador is a convention country for the purposes of all the provisions of the Act which relate to designs or trade-marks.
6. Where by the provisions of the Act any act or thing is required to be done in, or in relation to, a convention country, any such act or thing done before the date of the incorporation in Germany of the territory of the former Republic of Austria in, or in relation to, that territory, shall be deemed to have been done in, or in relation to, a convention country for the said purposes.
7. The Orders in Council mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.
