Pursuant to section 54 of the Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks Amendment Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order and declare as follows:-

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks Convention Order 1940, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks Convention Order 1940* (hereinafter referred to as the principal
- 2. The principal Order is hereby amended by inserting, after clause 6, the following clause:-
- "6A. Where by the provisions of the Act any act or thing is required to be done in, or in relation to, a convention country, any such act or thing done in, or in relation to, the territory of Austria during the period while the said territory was incorporated in Germany shall be deemed to have been done in, or in relation to, a convention country, and accordingly the said territory shall be deemed to be a convention country for the said purposes."
- 3. Part A of the First Schedule to the principal Order is hereby amended-
 - (a) By inserting, after the words "Palestine (excluding Trans-Jordan) ", the word "Singapore":

 (b) By inserting, after the word "Nauru", the word "Austria":

 - (c) By inserting, after the word "Denmark", the words "Dominican Republic ":
 - (d) By inserting, after the word "Hungary", the word "Israel":
 - (e) By inserting, after the word "Liechtenstein", the word "Luxembourg".
- 4. Part B of the First Schedule to the principal Order is hereby amended by omitting the words "Dominican Republic" and the word "Luxembourg".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.]

By this amendment Singapore, Austria, Dominican Republic, Israel, and Luxembourg are declared to be convention countries for the purposes of all the provisions of the Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks Act, 1921–22, and its amendments. Austria is to be deemed to have been a convention country at all times, including the period during which that country was incorporated in Germany.
