THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 54 of the Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks Amendment Act 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby orders and declares as follows:

**ORDER**

1. This order may be cited as the Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks Convention Order 1940, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks Convention Order 1940\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

2. Part A of the First Schedule to the principal order is hereby amended—

- (a) By inserting, after the word “Denmark”, the word “Finland”;  
(b) By inserting, after the word “Germany”, the word “Greece”.

3. Part B of the First Schedule to the principal order is hereby amended by omitting the words “Finland; Greece”.

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*[This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.]*

This order provides that Finland and Greece are to be recognized as convention countries for all the purposes of the Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks Act 1921-22.
