THE PATENTS, DESIGNS, AND TRADE MARKS CONVENTION ORDER 1968

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 29th day of October 1968

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 77 of the Patents Act 1953, section 20 of the Designs Act 1953, and section 72 of the Trade Marks Act 1953, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and, in relation to the Cook Islands, at the request and with the consent of the Cook Islands Government, hereby orders and declares as follows:

ORDER

1. Title—This order may be cited as the Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks Convention Order 1968.

2. Declaration of convention countries for all purposes of the Acts— Each of the countries named in Part A of the First Schedule hereto is a convention country for the purposes of all the provisions of the Patents Act 1953, the Designs Act 1953, and the Trade Marks Act 1953 (hereinafter referred to as the Acts).

3. Declaration of convention countries for certain purposes of the Acts—Each of the countries named in Part B of the First Schedule hereto is a convention country for the purposes of all the provisions of the Acts with the exception of the provisions contained in section 79 of the Patents Act 1953.

4. India and Pakistan—Each of the following countries, namely, India and Pakistan is a convention country for the purposes of all the provisions of the Patents Act 1953 with the exception of the provisions contained in section 79 thereof, and for the purposes of all the provisions of the Designs Act 1953. 5. Ecuador, Guatemala, and Costa Rica—Each of the following countries, namely, Ecuador, Guatemala, and Costa Rica is a convention country for the purposes of all the provisions of the Designs Act 1953 and the Trade Marks Act 1953.

6. Rhodesia and Nyasaland—Any act or thing done after the date of the dissolution of the Federation of Rhodesia and Nyasaland in or in relation to any part of the territory previously included in that country shall be deemed to have been done in or in relation to a convention country for the purposes of the Acts.

7. Application of order to Cook Islands, Niue, and Tokelau Islands— This order shall be in force in the Cook Islands, Niue, and the Tokelau Islands.

8. The Orders in Council referred to in the Second Schedule are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect. The countries mentioned in the order are declared to be convention countries for the purposes of the Patents Act 1953, the Designs Act 1953, and the Trade Marks Act 1953. The countries named in the First Schedule to the order are declared to be convention countries by reason of their membership of the Paris Union, which was established by the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property of 20 March 1883. Those countries named in Part A of the First Schedule have adhered to either the Hague, London, or Lisbon revisions of the Convention and are convention countries for all the purposes of the said Acts. The countries named in Part B of the First Schedule have adhered to the Washington revision only, and are not convention countries for the purposes of section 79 of the Patents Act 1953 relating to the possible infringement of patents by visiting vessels, aircraft, or land vehicles.

India and Pakistan are convention countries for the purposes mentioned in clause 4 of the above order pursuant to arrangements made with India in 1921. Ecuador, Guatemala, and Costa Rica are convention countries for the purposes mentioned in clause 5 of the order pursuant to treaties made with the United Kingdom, being treaties to which New Zealand acceded.
