1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Periodic Detention Centre (Walton Street (Te Awamutu)) Notice 1999.

(2) This notice takes effect from 16 July 1999.

2. Walton Street (Te Awamutu) Periodic Detention Centre—The land described in the Schedule is a periodic detention centre, to be known as the Walton Street (Te Awamutu) Periodic Detention Centre.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice, which takes effect from 16 July 1999, declares the Te Awamutu Courthouse to be a periodic detention centre (to be known as the Walton Street (Te Awamutu) Periodic Detention Centre). It replaces the present reporting centre in Te Awamutu.

The notice also revokes the notices establishing the Cambridge and Ngaruawahia reporting centres (which are now closed), and the present reporting centre in Te Awamutu.
