**THE PERIODIC DETENTION ORDER 1972**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 13th day of March 1972

THE RIGHT HON. J. R. MARSHALL PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 2 of the Criminal Justice Amendment Act 1962, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

---

**ORDER**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the Periodic Detention Order 1972.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 17th day of March 1972.

**2. Invercargill**—(1) Section 9 and sections 11 to 15 of the Criminal Justice Amendment Act 1962 shall apply with respect to male offenders who are of or over the age of 21 years and who are convicted after the commencement of this order—

- (a) In the Supreme Court at Invercargill; or
- (b) By a Magistrate's Court at Invercargill.

(2) Sections 10 to 15 of the said Act shall apply to male offenders who are of or over the age of 21 years and in respect of whom a warrant of commitment may be issued after the commencement of this order by a Judge of the Supreme Court at Invercargill or by a Magistrate's Court held at Invercargill in respect of a fine imposed on or after the 15th day of July 1963.
