Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 4 of the Emergency Regulations Continuance Act, 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Patents, Designs, Trade-marks, and Copyright Emergency Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Patents, Designs, Trade-marks, and Copyright Emergency Regulations 1940* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 9 of the principal regulations (as heretofore amended by Regulation 3 of the Patents, Designs, Trade-marks, and Copyright Emergency Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 1) is hereby further amended by adding to subclause (1) the following new paragraph:—

“(d) For payment to be made at the Office of any fee payable in New Zealand on and subsequent to an application for the grant of letters patent or for the registration of a design, trade-mark, or copyright, by or on behalf of an enemy in respect of an invention, design, trade-mark, or copyright,

which was not in existence before the first day of January, 1946, and where payment is so made under this paragraph the provisions of Regulation 6 (1) (i) and Regulation 6 (3) of these regulations shall not apply :

“ Provided, however, that any patent which is granted, or any design, trade-mark, or copyright which is registered, upon an application as aforesaid, shall be subject to any conditions and limitations with respect to duration, revocation, utilization, assignment, and licensing which may be imposed by any Act or regulations in accordance with the provisions of any treaty of peace hereafter entered into.”
