THE POLICE FORCE PAY REGULATIONS 1951

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 10th day of
April, 1951

Present :

THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Police Force Act, 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Police Force Pay Regulations 1951.

(2) These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1950.

2. The rates of pay and allowances payable to members of the Police Force shall be those set out in the First, Second, and Third Schedules hereto.

3. Payments at the rates set out in the said First Schedule shall be made in respect of service rendered on and after the 1st day of April, 1950, and before the 8th day of May, 1950, and payments at the rates set out in the said Second Schedule shall be made in respect of service rendered on and after the 8th day of May, 1950, and before the 15th day of February, 1951, and payments at the rates set out in the said Third Schedule shall be made in respect of service rendered on and after the 15th day of February, 1951.

4. Where a member of the Force of any rank is provided free of charge in respect of his employment with lodging for himself or his family or with the use of a house or is under the authority of these regulations paid an allowance instead of being so provided with lodging or with the use of a house, then, notwithstanding any other provision of these regulations, the annual value of those benefits for the purposes of section 55 of the Superannuation Act, 1947, is hereby declared to be the appropriate sum set out in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

5. The Police Force Pay Regulations 1950* are hereby revoked.
