THE POLICE FORCE PAY REGULATIONS 1953

C. W. M. NORRIE, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 11th day of March 1953 Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Police Force Act 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Police Force Pay Regulations, 1953.
- (2) These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of September 1952.
- 2. The rates of pay and allowances payable to members of the Police Force shall be those set out in the First Schedule hereto.
- 3. Payments at the rates aforesaid shall be made in respect of service rendered on and after the 1st day of September 1952.
- 4. Where a member of the Force of any rank is provided free of charge in respect of his employment with lodging for hunself or his family or with the use of a house or is under the authority of these regulations paid an allowance instead of being so provided with lodging or with the use of a house, then, notwithstanding any other provision of these regulations, the annual value of these benefits for the purposes of section 55 of the Superannuation Act 1917 is hereby declined to be the appropriate sum set out in the Second Schodule herete.
