## THE POLICE FORCE PAY REGULATIONS 1953, AMENDMENT NO. 1

At the Government House at Wellington, this 8th day of July 1953

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Police Force Act 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Police Force Pay Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Police Force Pay Regulations 1953\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.

**2.** Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following provisoes:

"Provided that where any member of the Force is serving as a radio technician and holds a rank referred to in the Third Schedule hereto, the rates of pay and allowances payable to that member shall be those set out in that Schedule:

"Provided also that where any member of the Force serving as a radio technician is promoted to a higher grade of any rank, he shall be entitled to the pay and allowances appropriate to that grade notwithstanding that he has not served the period of time indicated in the Third Schedule hereto as appropriate to that grade."

3. The principal regulations are hereby amended by adding the following Schedule as the Third Schedule thereto:

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations prescribe the rates of pay and allowances for members of the Force serving as radio technicians. The rates are the same as those in force for ordinary members of the Force, but increases in pay will take place at shorter intervals than those specified for ordinary members. Where a radio technician is promoted to a higher grade of any rank he will receive the pay appropriate to that rank notwithstanding that his period of service is not as long as that indicated in the Schedule as appropriate to the grade to which he has been promoted. This provision is not applicable to ordinary members of the Force.
