THE POLICE FORCE REGULATIONS 1950, AMENDMENT NO. 2

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 11th day of March 1953

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Police Force Act 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Police Force Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Police Force Regulations 1950* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) Except as otherwise provided herein, these regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 33, the following regulation:-

"33A. (1) For the purpose of assisting in the carrying out of police duties, members of the Force may be appointed by the Commissioner as radio technicians with such special designations as the Commissioner thinks fit.

"(2) Any candidate for the Force who does not comply with the requirements of regulation 32 hereof in respect of age or physique may be appointed to the Force by the Commissioner for service as a radio technician.

"(3) Any appointment under this regulation may be permanent or temporary and the provisions of these regulations shall apply to all persons so appointed:

"Provided that, except as provided by this regulation, no provisions of these regulations relating to promotions of members of the Force shall apply to members serving as radio technicians.

"(4) Any member of the Force serving under this regulation as a radio technician may be promoted to any rank or grade of rank in the Force.

"(5) To qualify for promotion to higher rank or grade of rank any member appointed under this regulation for service as a radio technician shall possess such standard of education and pass such examination in relation to radio as may be required by the Commissioner.

"(6) Where any member of the Force serving as a radio technician is promoted under this regulation, he shall retain the rank to which he has been promoted only while continuing to serve in the Force as a radio technician."

3. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 111, and substituting the following regulation:-

"111. Examinations qualifying for promotion shall be held annually at each district headquarters, due notice of which shall be given in the Police Gazette."

(2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of August 1951.

4. (1) Regulation 118 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after subparagraph (vi) of paragraph (b), the following subparagraph:-

"(vi A) Summary Jurisdiction Act 1952: ".

(2) Regulation 120 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after subparagraph (vi) of paragraph (b), the following subparagraph :---

"(vi A) Summary Jurisdiction Act 1952:".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

Regulation 2 provides for the appointment of members of the Police Force as radio technicians. Appointments may be made from inside or outside the present membership.

Regulation 3 provides for promotion examinations to be held annually on dates to be fixed by the authorities instead of in the month of September as was formerly the case.

Regulation 4 adds the Summary Jurisdiction Act 1952 to the list of Acts of which a knowledge is required by candidates for examinations.
