PURSUANT to section 71 of the Private Investigators and Security Guards Act 1974, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Private Investigators and Security Guards Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Private Investigators and Security Guards Regulations 1975* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1987.

2. New scale of fees substituted—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Second Schedule (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Private Investigators and Security Guards Regulations 1975,

Amendment No. 1), and substituting the Second Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

3. Revocation—The Private Investigators and Security Guards Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 1 are hereby revoked.
