**THE PRIMARY INDUSTRIES EMERGENCY REGULATIONS
1939, AMENDMENT NO. 3**

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 17th day of
June, 1942.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Primary Industries Emergency Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and form part of the Primary Industries Emergency Regulations 1939* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

2. The principal regulations are amended by inserting therein, next after Regulation 7c thereof (as inserted by Regulation 2 of the Primary Industries Emergency Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 1), the following additional regulation :—

“ 7d. (1) The Minister may from time to time, as he thinks fit, appoint for matters affecting any primary product an advisory committee consisting of not less than five persons under such name as is designated in the instrument of appointment.

“ (2) The functions of a committee shall be to advise the Minister whenever requested by the Minister so to do, on any matter in relation to the exercise of any of the powers or functions conferred on him or on the Controller by these regulations in so far as they relate to the primary product for matters affecting which the committee is appointed.

“ (3) The members of a committee shall hold office during the pleasure of the Minister.

“(4) At any meeting of a committee a quorum shall consist of not less than three-fifths of the members of the committee for the time being.

“(5) A meeting of a committee may at any time be convened by the Controller to be held at a time and place reasonable notice of which is given by the Controller to each of the members, and a meeting of the committee shall be held at any time and place fixed by the committee at some previous meeting, reasonable notice thereof being given to members not present at such previous meeting :

“Provided that no meeting shall be deemed irregular through the accidental non-receipt by a member of a notice required by this clause.

“(6) In matters not provided for by these regulations a committee may regulate its own procedure.

“(7) The Travelling-allowance Regulations 1941* shall apply to and be deemed to be incorporated in these regulations so as to relate to an advisory committee and its members.

“(8) The subsistence allowance referred to in Regulation 4 of the Travelling-allowance Regulations 1941* shall be at the rate of £1 per day.

“(9) The mileage allowances and other allowances referred to in Regulation 11 of the Travelling-allowance Regulations 1941* shall for journeys performed in a motor-vehicle be the mileage-allowances set out in the subjoined table and actual garage expenses, not exceeding 2s. 6d. for every night :—

Horse-power of Car.	Mileage-allowance.
Not exceeding 9½	d. 4½
Not exceeding 14½	5
Over 14½	5½
