NOTICE

1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Penal Institutions (Arohata Prison) Notice (No. 2) 1998.

(2) This notice takes effect from 17 December 1998.

2. Arohata Prison—The land described in the Schedule is declared to be a prison and a corrective training institution, to be known as Arohata Prison.

3. Revocation—The Penal Institutions (Arohata Prison) Notice 1998* is revoked.

All that parcel of land in the Wellington Land District containing 24.2862 hectares, more or less, situate in the City of Wellington, being part Section 32, Porirua District, and being all the land comprised and described in certificate of title No. 46C/384 Limited as to Parcels, Wellington Registry.
