NOTICE

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This notice may be cited as the Penal Institutions (New Plymouth Prison) Notice 1998.

(2) This notice comes into force on 5 June 1998.

**2. New Plymouth Prison**—The land described in the Schedule is declared to be a prison, to be known as New Plymouth Prison.

**3. Revocations**—The following parts of notices are revoked:

- (a) Clause 5 and the Fourth Schedule of the Penal Institutions Notice 1955\*;
- (b) Clause 2 of the Penal Institutions Notice 1984† and so much of the Schedule of that notice as relates to the land first described in that Schedule.

## NEW PLYMOUTH PRISON

All that parcel of land in the Taranaki Land District containing 3.5839 hectares, more or less, situate in Block V, Paritutu Survey District, being Section 1 on Survey Office Plan 13324, and Section 1 on Survey Office Plan 13406, and being all the land comprised and described in certificate of title No. J4/731, Taranaki Registry.

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This notice, which comes into force on 5 June 1998, is made under the Penal Institutions Act 1954. It declares the land described in the Schedule to be a prison, to be known as New Plymouth Prison. This notice replaces previous notices relating to New Plymouth Prison.

This notice updates and consolidates the legal description of New Plymouth Prison.
