1 Title

This notice is the Penal Institutions (Don Street (Invercargill) Police Jail) Notice 2001.

2 Commencement

This notice takes effect from 8 November 2001.

3 Don Street (Invercargill) Police Jail

The land described in the Schedule is a police jail, to be known as the Don Street (Invercargill) Police Jail.

4 Revocation

The Schedule of the Penal Institutions (Police Jails) Notice (No 4) 1987 (SR 1987/396) is amended by revoking item 8.

cl 3 Schedule Don Street (Invercargill) Police Jail

All that parcel of land in the Southland Land District containing 3328 square metres, more or less, being Lot 1 on Deposited Plan 12753 and Lot 1 on Deposited Plan 13986, and being part Sections 4, 5, 6, and 7, Block LXIII, Town of Invercargill, and being all the land comprised and described in certificate of title No. SL11B/257, Southland Registry.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice, which takes effect from 8 November 2001, is made under the Penal Institutions Act 1954. It declares the land described in the *Schedule* to be a police jail, to be known as Don Street (Invercargill) Police Jail. The land is at Don Street, Invercargill. It is used for the purposes of, and has on it 1 or more buildings known as, the Invercargill Police Station.

This notice revokes and replaces parts of a previous notice that declared the Invercargill Police Station to be a police jail.
