



**THE PIG MARKETING EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1943,  
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL.**

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 28th day of April, 1943.

Present :

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Pig Marketing Emergency Regulations 1943, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Pig Marketing Emergency Regulations 1943\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. (1) Regulation 8 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following paragraphs to subclause (1) thereof:—

“(c) Frozen carcasses of porkers, baconers, or overweight baconers which are in any establishment of a kind referred to in paragraph (b) hereof, whether the pigs from which they were derived were killed before or after the commencement of these regulations :

“(d) Any other class or description of meat, whether fresh-killed or frozen, which is in any establishment of a kind referred to in paragraph (b) hereof, and which has been derived from porkers, baconers, or overweight baconers, whether killed before or after the commencement of these regulations.”

(2) Regulation 8 of the principle regulations is hereby further amended by adding the following subclause thereto:—

“(3) For the purposes of this regulation the term ‘fresh-killed’, with respect to any meat, includes meat which has been chilled but not frozen.”
