PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Postal Note Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Postal Note Regulations 1940* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 2. Regulation 6 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the figures " $40~0~\dots$ 6".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

The regulations permit the issue of postal notes for an amount of 40s. and prescribe a poundage of 6d. in respect of notes of that denomination.
